

b Add the necessary rest or rests at * to complete each bar.






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2 Rewrite this melody with the notes correctly grouped.







3 Rewrite the given melody at the same pitch using the bass clef.

- **8** Add the following terms and signs to the music:
 - (i) Above the stave at the beginning write the word which means that the music should be sung fairly quickly.
 - (ii) Below the stave in bar 1 show that the music begins softly.
 - (iii) Below the stave in bar 9 show that the music gets louder.
 - (iv) Below the stave in bar 13 show that the music gets softer.
 - (v) Above the stave in bar 19 show that the music becomes a little slower.

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- 9 (i) Name the major key as shown by the key signature:
 - (ii) Name the minor key which shares the same key signature, i.e. the relative minor:
 - (iii) Give the number of any one bar which contains only notes of the tonic triad: bar
 - (iv) Draw circles around 2 accidentals which do not belong to the key.
